Independent Auditor's Report

We have audited the accompanying financial statements "ARALU GRAMEENA MATTU NAGARABHIVRUDDI SAMSTHE, LAXMESHWAR", Reg. GDG-S343-2014-15 TQ: LAXMESHWAR DIST GADAG. The Receipt & Payment for year ending March 31, 2022, and the Income and Expenditure A/c & Balance Sheet for the year then ended.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the financial statements give the information required by the Act in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India:
