It is my pleasure to present the Annual Report of REACH for the year 2020-21 before you. Rural Environmental Awareness Community Help (REACH) is a non-profit organization set up in 1992 under Karnataka State Society Registration act 1960 in Ballari district in Karnataka. Conceived as a grassroots level voluntary organization, REACH looked at addressing the development of the most vulnerable and marginalized sections of the poor living in the remote areas and neglected villages. During the year REACH extended its activities to Ballari, Vijayapur, Gadag & Bagalkot districts, working in 84 Gram Panchayat villages on IMAGE Next.

REACH has made interventions in 226 villages of Bagalkot, Gadag, and District of Karnataka. Working with over 130 SHGs, 42 Jaivika Krushikara Sangha's and Cooli's sangha's community have been empowering through a right-based approach to address poverty, vulnerability, livelihood, social issues like child labour, gender, violence against women and women rights, child trafficking, women property rights, Disability Sector, Environmental Issues etc., In all these efforts, REACH adopted education as a means of creating change and bringing awareness to the community. A major part of the program was carried out through networking with like-minded NGOs and building collective strength for local initiatives.

CHILDLINE is a national, 24- hour, free emergency phone outreach service – for children in need of care and protection. It's a project of the Ministry of Women & Child Development in partnership with NGOs.

Aim: To see that every child in distress feels Accepted, Wanted, Protected and Cared. Reach out to every child in need of care and protection by responding to emergencies on 1098. Work together with the Allied systems to create child friendly systems, Advocate for services that are inaccessible, non-existent or inadequate.

Renewable energy Awareness for SHG and Elected Representative Supported MGIRED

Renewable energy Awareness for SHG and Elected Representative Supported by MGIRED Organize the program in Village level for SHG women for Renewable energy to awareness create and local resource usage and government schemes and services educate to helping the community. 5 SHG Programs covered 340 Women and Gram Panchayath Elected representative participated. They started the energy saving and utilizing the government schemes for solar usage.



Bio- Sand Water Filter:

The biosand filter (BSF) is a simple household water treatment device, which is an innovation on traditional slow sand filters specifically designed for intermittent use. A BSF consists of a concrete or plastic container filled with specially selected and prepared sand and gravel. As water flows through the filter, physical straining removes pathogens, iron, turbidity and manganese from drinking water. A shallow layer of water sits atop the sand and a biofilm develops. The biofilm contributes to the removal of pathogens due to predation and competition for food of non-harmful microorganisms contained in the biofilm and the harmful organisms in the water.
