Health Awareness

Our target area people were unaware of general and personal hygiene and health practices. Children and their mothers suffer the most. They got easily affected to communicable diseases like malaria, measles etc. We had conducted many health care awareness camps in the Block to avoid such diseases. Over 67men, women and children participated in the camps.

Prenatal care

Awareness for pregnant women was conducted on village level Panchayats. They were advised to be aware of child birth (9 months + 5 or 7 days) and the date of conceiving. Administered them with two immunizations soon after the date of conceiving is important. If the expected childbirth is second one, administered with one immunization soon after the date of conceiving. Instructions on marrying a girl child, their weight and height and their age of marriage (21 years) are advised to be followed strictly.



Prenatal Care Awareness programme was given to the people of village panchayats

Postnatal care

- Nutritious meal should be fed to the baby after 6 months of birth.
- Mother's first milk should be fed to the child as it contain immune power BCG immunization should administer for the baby within 14 days of the birth.
- Orientation meeting and awareness on postnatal care was generated with the following measures, immunizations at times should be given to the babies.
- Nutritious meal should be fed to the baby after 6 months of birth.
- During delivery mother may suffer from over bleeding and fits in such situation proper care must be taken to save the mother.
- Breast-feeding at least for 6 months should be given to babies.
- Supplementary food should be given from 3rd month onwards.
- Childbirth may be critical for the mother of below 19 years leading to the loss of the mother or the baby and or the both. Therefore, experienced doctors group should conduct the delivery.

Skill Training For Adolescent Girls:-

SACEWD conducted unemployed educated young girls, and women's skills development programme. A total of 80 women and girls from rural areas of Pudukkottai district benefitted through the projects.

The 100 days tailoring training programme was sponsored by TNSDC Chennai. SACEWD is on the process of obtaining employment for these women and girls.

SACEWD gives priorities in developing the adolescent girls. 80 teenagers are trained on embroidery, tailoring, preparing the nutrition flour, paper bags, commercial envelops, developing kitchen herbal gardens, handloom, Coconut leaf roof-top making, Milk products and fur, etc., many of them are producing consumers goods through the skills.

The Training was conducted for poor Educated women in the age group of 20-35 they are well trained by trainer. The training was conducted for 12 days from 3rd to 14th October 2020. Every day the training started at 10.00 a.m and completed at 3.30 p.m. The training meets the needs of the poor educated matured SHGs women. This training will help them to start their own Computer and Internet centre.



They are earning at least Rs.2, 500 to Rs.3, 000 per month. This will enable them to meet out their family expenditure. This income will improve their social status. They get reorganization in their family as well as their surroundings. This will encourage the female education. This training will improve the personal health and hygiene of the rural poor women. Therefore this project is in dire need of the time in this area.

Mother and Child Health Care :

SACEWD organized the Health awareness programme was implemented in the villages Panchayat of Mullanguruchi Karambakkudi Union of Pudukkottai district in Tamilnadu. The pregnant women, lactating mothers, children and school going children are affected by malnutrition. The organization advised to give nutritive meals to these people. The following information was shared among the people in general and women in particular.

- ✤ A woman at the age of 19 is physically ready for marriage.
- ✤ A woman with a weight of 45 Kg. qualifies for delivery.
- ✤ A woman with a height of 145 centimeter could be able deliver a baby.
- During the pregnancy, from the first month to 9th month in total 10 Kg. weight should increase.
- When pregnancy is confirmed, immunization should be done
- The new born baby should have 3 kg. Weight.
- As soon as the baby is born the periods for the immunization and inoculation should be explained.
- The importance of breast feeding and due to breast feeding the conceiving of second baby will be delayed.
- Physical changes among the adolescent girls were explained
- It was informed that after conceiving, the woman will deliver the baby within 9 months and 5 to 7 days' time.

Indigenous Women Programme:

The indigenous women are less educated and the only potential they have is their willingness to take up hard work. The training sessions were little difficult as the resource persons had to make the training aspect very simple and also lots of illustrations had to be designed to make the women understand the concepts.

But the efforts were taken up to make them understand the techniques they should follow to make their products innovative. The size and designs which they could follow to make it innovative was also oriented to the women. The women were able to learn the skills in a slow manner only. The women were motivated to make their products in a different manner in order to increase their sales and also to find better income out of the products. So the training aspect was a difficult one to make them to fully understand the concept. But they were made to realize the aspects and thus the training was made very effective. The production part was also little difficult during the first month. Gradually the field visits and the motivation given to them had brought better results and thus it was resolved in a phase of manner.

FEED THE MINDS United Kingdom has supported SACEWD for training 40 poor rural women and girls to obtain training on Sanitary Napkin production. These 40 participants are divided based on their Social Economic and Cultural back grounds such as 2 women from HIV/ AIDS affected families, 4 from above women cargoes and others are from socially depressed dalit women .These 40 women and girls are liked with nationalized banks for obtaining loans and they got loans from banks.

They are preparing Sanitary Napkins and marketing the same and near they are earning at least Rs. 2500- 3000 P.M after passing their loans dues.
