Health Awareness

The people in our service area are ignorant of the general and personal hygiene and health practices. Particularly the children and mothers suffer due to this unawareness. They contract diseases like malaria, diarrhoea, T.B., Covid -19, measles etc. In order to prevent these diseases we had conducted health awareness camps in 10 panchayats in Karambakkudi, Thiruvarangulam and Pudukkottai Block. In each of the panchayats over two hundred men, women and children participated in the daylong camps.

Seminar was conducted to make people aware on the incidences of HIV/AIDS at Thirumalairayarsamuthiram, Mullanguruchi Panchayats of Pudukkottai and Karambakkudi Union of Pudukkottai district.

The number of HIV/AIDS affected people is increasing. HIV/AIDS positive cases are increasing very fast. It is a big threat to the community and it should be tackled at the earliest. It requires the concern of the individuals, families, societies and the country. The causes for the HIV/AIDS was explained and also informed that there was no medicine and treatment available for the killer disease. The only possibility is that AIDS could be prevented and it cannot be cured. The use of condom was explained to safeguard and protect the people from HIV/AIDS. The affected people could not be neglected from the house and the society. Instead they should be given counseling, community care, nutritive food, etc. Their family members should be given assistance to impart technical skill training, income generation activities, etc.

Environment Awareness

Environment and Ecology Awareness sessions were conducted in 11 villages in our service area. Under this programme sensitization meetings were held on the importance of growing of trees in the roadsides, avoidance of usage of plastic articles, prevention of application of chemical fertilizers etc.

Due to the hole in the Ozone Zone we are experiencing high temperature and heavy rains even at out of seasons. We have to keep our surroundings clean and must grow home gardens using wastewater and can raise herbals in such plots. These were some of the matters discussed in detail at these meetings.

True Dreams Project India is a network for girl children educational development. we conduct special coaching classes through this network. There are 86 NGOs in Tamilnadu in this network(Total Teachers are 3000 and Students are 60000, in 26 districts) these Teachers and students are organized by 24 cluster Co-ordinators, 46 Block Co-ordinators and 6 Regional Co-ordinators in the state.

True Dreams Project India is a network for girl children educational development. Evening 5pm to 7 pm classes for school going children, one centre 20 children in this area we conduct special coaching classes through this network. There are 86 NGOs in Tamilnadu in this network.

This COVID 19, threatens the human being heavily in 2019 and its crucial face is being continued till date. Medical camp treatment at our door step, is considered as an essential way of finding diseases and treating well the people from infections.

Indigenous Women Programme:

The SACEWD Trust conducted on Skills Training for Indigenous women are less educated and the only potential they have is their willingness to take up hard work. The training sessions are Palm leaf production , Terracotta, Sea ornaments, Beats production and Banking skills were little difficult as the resource persons had to make the training aspect very simple and also lots of illustrations had to be designed to make the women understand the concepts.

But the efforts were taken up to make them understand the techniques they should follow to make their products innovative. The size and designs which they could follow to make it innovative was also oriented to the women. The women were able to learn the skills in a slow manner only. The women were motivated to make their products in a different manner in order to increase their sales and also to find better income out of the products. So the training aspect was a difficult one to make them to fully understand the concept. But they were made to realize the aspects and thus the training was made very effective. The production part was also little difficult during the first month. Gradually the field visits and the motivation given to them had brought better results and thus it was resolved in a phase of manner. The shyness and inferiority complex which they had developed was very difficult to make them to come out of the same. Now they are very bold and also are able to express their thoughts and also to move with the people in the market to sell at better margin.

Training on minor millets cultivation :

Minor millets play vital role in enhancing the health status of the people. Minor millets like Ragi, Campu, Thinai, varagu, etc., are the important for preparing cakes, rice, dosai, nutrients powder, halwa, etc., Moreover, consuming these minor millets prevents people from diseases and improve the health status. The training was conducted for 40 SHG Women farmers.

Health Awareness

Our target area people were unaware of general and personal hygiene and health practices. Children and their mothers suffer the most. They got easily affected to communicable diseases like malaria, measles etc. We had conducted many health care awareness camps in the Block to avoid such diseases. Over 82 men, women and children participated in the camps.

Prenatal care

Awareness for pregnant women were conducted on village level Panchayats. They were advised to be aware of child birth (9 months + 5 or 7 days) and the date of conceiving. Administered them with two immunizations soon after the date of conceiving is important. If the expected childbirth is second one, administered with one immunization soon after the date of conceiving. Instructions on marrying a girl child, their weight and height and their age of marriage (21 years) are advised to be followed strictly.

Postnatal care:

- ❖ Orientation meeting and awareness on postnatal care was generated with the following measures.
- ❖ During delivery mother may suffer from over bleeding and fits in such situation proper care must be taken to save the mother.
- ❖ Breast-feeding at least for 6 months should be given to babies.
- ❖ Supplementary food should be given from 3rd month onwards.
- ❖ Nutritious meal should be fed to the baby after 6 months of birth.
- ❖ Mother's first milk should be fed to the child as it contain immune power BCG immunization should administer for the baby within 14 days of the birth.
- ❖ Immunizations at times should be given to the babies.
- ❖ Childbirth may be critical for the mother of below 19 years leading to the loss of the mother or the baby and or the both. Therefore, experienced doctors group should conduct the delivery.

Sanitary Napkin

The Training on manufacturing of Sanitary Napkins was conducted for poor Educated women The training was conducted for 15 days. Every day the training started at 9.30 a.m and completed at 3.30 p.m. The training meets the needs of the poor educated matured SHGs women. This training will help them to start their own Sanitary Napkin unit . They will earn at least Rs.3, 500 to Rs.4, 000 per month. This will enable them to meet out their family expenditure. Women are now recognized in their family as well as their surroundings.

This will encourage the female education. This training will improve the personal health and hygiene of the rural poor women.

Herbal pesticide

5 types of herbal leaves with bitter taste, cow urine for 30 days in a plastic vessel bundled in cotton cloth and close airtight and after 20 days mix again and after 45 days becomes usable and apply to plants. Green student volunteers, this Green Volunteer Students programme is being implemented in association with the SACEWD Trust, Thirumalairaya Samuthiram, Pudukkottai Block, Pudukkottai District.

In association with the SACEWD Trust Vettanviduthi, we have also implemented the following programmes in six villages namely Pappanviduthi - Organic Farming, Manakollai - Organic farming, S. Vandanviduthi - Milch animals, Ponnannaviduthi - Organic Farming, Kulavaipatti - Organic Farming and Pachikottai - Milch animals. Women Self Help Group members in 5 villages were given training on vermin compost production and application. The trainings were of practical nature to cater to the needs of the women who are semi-literate.

Self Help Group Programmes:

Likewise in the former year rural and urban women are organized into groups termed as Self Help Groups (SHGs). SACEWD has gathered 10130 women into 530 self help groups among women in Karambakkudi block and 25 self help groups among women at the villages of Pudukkottai and Thiruvarankulam Unions.

Basic training was given to these groups and enabled to get loans by direct linkage with Banks. Approximately 393 groups were given training. The entrepreneurial trainings were given to 315 self help groups and the skill trainings were conducted through Ministry of textiles. The Mahalir thittam has guided self help group members in marketing, exposure visit, etc.

Sustainable agriculture

In order to reduce the usage of chemical Fertilizers and pesticides alternative measures like awareness on sustainable agricultural practices and its preparation was encouraged. Rural SHG members were trained on its preparation and enabled to practice it on their own fields. Usage and production of vermi compost, Panchakaviyam, Non-Toxic, EMI, Herbal toxic and Herbal pesticides were encouraged.

Same training was encouraged and advised to follow on almost all the beneficiaries home. Field Farmers' Schools were also conducted to provide practical training to farmers on Vermi compost Bio- integrated pest management, bioorganic manure application, single crop system, simultaneous agriculture methods throughout the village and the methods to sustain agriculture during natural disasters. Intensive training on these sustainable agricultural practices were followed in which the ignorant people were trained on the preparation of vermi compost, compost, herbal pesticides, herbal tonics, panchakaviya, neem tonic, EMI, etc., to apply the same in their cultivation. All these products are made by utilizing the locally available materials and wastes from cattle sheds, kitchen and agriculture fields.

Computer Education :

The Training was conducted for poor Educated women in the age group of 20-35 they are well trained by trainer. The training was conducted for 10 days. Every day the training started at 10.00 a.m and completed at 1.00 p.m. The training meets the needs of the poor educated girls and women. This training will help them to start their own Computer units and DTP centers.

They are earning at least Rs.5,000 per month. This will enable them to meet out their family expenditure. This income will improve their social status. They get reorganization in their family as well as their surroundings. This will encourage the female education. This training will improve the personal health and hygiene of the rural poor women. Therefore this project is in dire need of the time in this area.

Tailoring & Embroidery training to the teenagers:

While giving priorities for the women's development SACEWD Trust have given priorities in developing the adolescent girls. More than 185 teenagers are trained on Tailoring & Embroidery , preparing the nutrition flour, paper bags, commercial envelops, developing kitchen herbal gardens, handloom, Coconut leaf roof-top making, Milk products and fur, etc., Now many of them are evolving in producing the articles.

This training will help them to start their own production unit.

They are earning at least Rs.4, 000 to Rs.4, 500 per month. This will enable them to meet out their family expenditure. This income will improve their social status. They get reorganization in their family as well as their surroundings. This will encourage the female education. This training will improve the personal health and hygiene of the rural poor women.
