The registration as Trust was done at Udupi Registration Office and its registration number is (VIDE DOCUMENT NO.) UDP-IV-00072-2014-15. Activities

1. 'Suraksha': Reduction of Life Style Diseases through Improved Health Status and Enhanced Quality of Life. A project from CARITAS INDIA, started from 01 January 2018.

This project is about to improve quality of health and providing sanitation in Karnataka State; with the cluster of 14 societies/Trusts. The impact statement is 'The health status of the targeted vulnerable population in the working area of the Diocesan Social Service Society (DSSS) is improved'. Its expected outcome was: By the end of June 2019, the targeted vulnerable population will get health related services from 1,000 volunteers in the Diocesan Social Service Societies (DSSSs) in Karnataka. By the end of project period, partner organization move towards self-sustainability with the support of volunteer base. By the end of the project, 80% of the target households will have food sovereignty and thus their health status is improved.

This year we had only 3 months activities of the project. Handbills regarding health and hygiene were prepared on the topic and the Inauguration of the Project was done by releasing handbill on 06th March 2018. Handbills were distributed throughout the District. Training regarding health and sanitation was given to 76 members of 5 SHG.as a result at Bola, Karkala 15 families came together and cleaned their water resource.



2. Preservation of Earth

'Each community can take from the bounty of the earth whatever it needs for subsistence, but it also has the duty to protect the earth and to ensure its fruitfulness for coming generations'. Pope Francis in *Laudato Si*. SAMPADA UDUPI initiated two programs to protect Environment:

Rainwater Harvesting: Rainwater harvesting, is a process that involves **collecting rainwater** and increasing its value by eliminating impurities or directing it to places where its use is highly required. Even though Udupi district has very high fall of rain, still during summer season there is scarcity of water. For this reason this program.

Forestation Program: This is to increase the greenery in the district.it is a program to plant and protect the saplings.

3. Healthy food for healthy families:

From the inception SAMPADA wanted healthy families; which grow their own possible food stock in a healthy way. So we introduced three family gardens that is Vegetable garden, Medicinal plants garden and Fruits garden. This became a useful tool to improve the food security of rural, urban and semi-urban families. In our District their number of families who had these garden increased year by year.

4. De-addiction Camps

The goal of a de-addiction camp is "to help [addicts] become clean, get employment, and lead a normal life," De-addiction camps are also a cheaper alternative to the programmes at de-addiction centres – allowing some addicts to receive help they otherwise never would have. We conducted de-addiction camps to help the patients to know about themselves, their state of life, so that to promote him to either go to de-addiction center or to be a member of Alcoholic Anonymous (AA) Groups. We conducted two de-addiction camps: first was at Attur Basilica Campus from 06th April to 09th April 2017, in collaboration With Jnanodaya Mangalore and St Lawrence Shrine. The second was at Udyavara on 21st to 24th March 2018 in collaboration with Jnanodaya Mangalore; Catholic Sabha, Udyavara; Ashakirana, Heroor Brahmavara. Total 56 sick people were treated; some were referred to further treatment.





5. House for homeless families.

SAMPADA is a charitable organization. Every year it takes an issue / cause, give awareness to the public, collect funds through donation coupon and then distribute it for the needy. This year we had the theme 'Housing needs of the poor'. An amount of Rs 12,28,030/= was collected through donation / luckydip coupons. 28 families who were constructing new houses were given a help of Rs 8,75,000, and 17 families were given help of Rs 3,85,000 to repair their houses.

Kuwait Canara Welfare Association (KCWA) was our main donor; who had established **KCWA** Education Fund to help the needy students. Once or twice a year we invite all the beneficiaries for a day's motivation program.

9. Self Help Group to Mahasangha (Local Federations) to Taluka Federation:

Self-help groups are seen as instruments for goals including empowering women, developing leadership abilities among poor and the needy people. In the beginning we had Self-Help Groups in every wards of the locality. Then we formed the Local Grass root Level Federations which we called Mahasangha's. They were formed village levels, and some time Parish levels. They had their office bearers and a bank account for financial administration. In the month of March 2018, in Karkala Taluka level Arpana Federation was started.

10. SAMPADA and SAMPADA SAMBHANDA:

In the month of August 2015, a two pages monthly bulletin in Konkani language was started to give information to the women in SHGs. It was named as 'Sampada Sambhanda'. Thereafter, it was published in every month and sent to each and every SHG's through post. From June 2018 a Kannada version was started to cater non Konkani SHGs. This bulletin contains spiritual thoughts, celebrations of that month, rules and regulations of SHGs and Mahasangha's, small information regarding ecology, local herbal medicines, introducing the women achievers, information about Government schemes, family values, children and youth and their upbringing, etc.

Implementing Projects of other Organizations

Canara Organization for Development and Peace (CODP) Mangalore, before the establishment of SAMPADA was working as a catholic development organization in the District of Udupi. When Mangalore diocese was divided, it handed over the projects of Udupi district to SAMPADA Udupi, to implement them in their name.

1. Women Empowerment Project in Karkala Taluka:

This was cluster program sponsored by Misereior and lead by KROSS Bangalore. One coordinator and 3 coordinators worked under this program. Karkala Taluka was covered under this project. This year received a grant of Rs 5,61,867 in this Project. We implemented this Project under CODP Mangalore.
